## Dear President Trump:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, representing the nation's leading professional medical organizations in the field of obstetrics and gynecology, we write today regarding the recent Executive Order on Protecting Vulnerable Newborn and Infant Children, signed September 25, 2020. This Executive Order seeks to advance a false narrative for political gain and we have serious concerns about the negative impacts it may have on the women and families for whom we care. We therefore strongly oppose the Executive Order and call for its immediate rescindment.

Policy related to reproductive health care must be based on medical science and facts. The government can serve a valuable role in creating health policy when its purpose is to improve patient health and advance medical and scientific progress.<sup>ii</sup> Instead, this Executive Order attempts to inject politicians into the patient-physician relationship and uses harmful rhetoric that serves to undermine the public trust in physicians, stigmatize necessary health care for women, and heartlessly disregards the tragedies and difficult decisions women and their families face.

Compassionate, evidence-based care provided by obstetrician-gynecologists and other women's health medical professionals should never be subject to politicians' personal ideologies, especially when they are not based in science. The Order's attempt at intimidation of physicians, patients, and families is concerning. We ask that you immediately rescind Executive Order 13952.
