Dr. Eleni Tousimis is a board certified General Surgeon who specializes in breast cancer surgery. She recently joined Medstar Georgetown University Hospital, Lombardi Comprehensive Cancer Center as the Chief of the Division of Breast Surgery in Washington D.C. Dr. Tousimis attended Dartmouth and Mount Holyoke College where she graduated cum laude. She then received her medical degree from Albany Medical College. Following her breast surgery fellowship training at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in 2001, she completed additional specialty training in minimally invasive surgery of the breast at the European Institute of Oncology in Milan, Italy. Dr. Tousimis was previously Associate Professor of Clinical Surgery at the Weill Cornell Medical College, New York Presbyterian Hospital for the last 9 years and served as Associate Program Director of Surgical Education. She has been recognized for her pursuit of new initiatives in breast cancer management, including nipple sparing mastectomy, partial breast radiation and new anesthetic techniques for breast surgery. As a well-respected clinician, researcher and teacher, Dr. Tousimis has received numerous awards and holds leadership positions in several professional societies and acts as section editor of the Aesthetic Plastic Surgery Journal. She has been recognized as a Castle Connolly's Top Doctors, Top Surgeons and Best Doctors in 2009–2012. AMWA is a Founding Partner of the Sex and Gender Women's Health Collaborative (SGWHC)

AMWA is one of three founding partners of the Sex and Gender Women's Health Collaborative (SGWHC), the first and only digital resource dedicated solely to sex and gender evidence based care to promote health and improve disease outcomes (http://sgwhc.org). AMWA provides this resource along with the American College of Women's Health Physicians (ACWHP) and the Society of Women's Health Research (SWHR). Formerly the Advancing Women's Health Initiative, the SGWHC is proud to represent more than 20 medical and health institutions and professional organizations who have joined the founding partners — AMWA, ACWHP, and SWHR — and the federal Offices of Women's Health, to further this effort and benefit from shared resources.

At **SGWHC.org**, medical students, nurse practitioners/nurses, and allied health faculty and providers have open access to the single largest online collection of medical education curricula and teaching tools. This evolving content aims to foster sex and gender sensitivity in delivering optimal care for all. Despite substantial evidence of differences in symptoms, responses and outcomes based on sex and gender, medical research and practice remain largely based on the model of the 70kg white

male. Women are not small men, but more significantly, sex and gender variability go beyond obvious reproductive distinctions. Every cell has a sex. This collaborative supports the recommendations of the 2010 IOM Report on Women's Health Research, which states that while "over half of the U.S. population is female, gaps remain both in research areas and in the application of results to benefit women in general and across multiple population groups."

The collaborative welcomes all institutions and organizations within the medical, nursing, and allied health professions to work together to expand the Sex and Gender resource base, raise awareness, and advance the adoption of sex and gender content into medical curricula and practice.

For nearly a century, AMWA has championed the importance of women's health. This initiative will help ensure that sex and gender based medicine becomes an integral part of every medical school's curriculum.



A Visit to the Van Hoosen Farm, Home of AMWA's Founder, Dr. Bertha Van Hoosen

Last September, AMWA Past President Dr. Mary Guinan was the keynote speaker at the Broomfield Center for Leadership at the Rochester Hills Museum at Van Hoosen Farm. From her we learned of the 150th birthday celebration of Dr. Bertha Van Hoosen to be held at the farm on March 26, 2013.

Having always wanted to make the pilgrimage to Rochester Hills, MI, I couldn't pass up the opportunity. So after some hasty last minute travel plans, one week later I found myself driving through the quiet countryside of Rochester Hills, Michigan with museum representatives Frank Cardimen and Mary Eberline. Eberline had grown up in one of the Van Hoosen homes and attended the same one-room school as Dr. Bertha. As a young girl, she and her mother once had tea with Dr. Bertha and other fine ladies of the day. The Van Hoosen Farm has been preserved as a historical landmark and museum thanks to the City of Rochester Hills and the dedication of Museum Supervisor, Patrick McKay. Under McKay's guidance and vision over the past 27 years, the museum has continued to grow and flourish.

A gathering of local residents, medical students and girl scouts turned out for the birthday celebration, and historian Maureen Thalmann presented a wonderful synopsis of Dr. Bertha's life,

from her childhood in Stony Creek, to her parents' disapproval of her choice to pursue medicine, to her prominent career as an obstetrical surgeon.

Stepping across the threshold of the Van Hoosen home, I was swept back in time

as I imagined her sitting at the wooden desk with her thinrimmed glasses reading medical books or seeing patients on her small examination table. Her office remains as it did back in the 1940s, complete with medicinal vials, doctor's bag, typewriter, prescription pad and personal papers. Artifacts from her many trips abroad decorate the quaint 1820s farm house, which has retained most of the original furnishings, including an oldfashioned electric stove, her mother's wicker rocking chair, a rope style bed predating our modern spring mattresses, and the famed horse-hair lounge upon which Dr. Bertha made her

decision to pursue medicine. Books adorn most of the rooms, as reading was an important past-time of the Van Hoosens. Relics of a life well-lived fill the house: a souvenir from the AMWA meeting of 1941, photographs of Dr. Bertha as a student and as a surgeon, and a note card with the inscription,

With Best Wishes,
Bertha Van Hoosen
Eighty-five years, — still at it
Sixty years a surgeon
One year — an author
Forever, your friend

In this small community of Rochester Hills, the Van Hoosen name is well known. Dr. Sarah Van Hoosen, Dr. Bertha's niece, earned her PhD in animal genetics and became one of the first women in America to become a "Master Farmer." Her innovative farm methods led to the dairy farm's success and the Van Hoosen farm was internationally renowned for its prized breed of dairy cows and fine quality products.

So if you're ever in the Detroit area, drive out to the Van Hoosen Farm Museum. Experience history at its finest and walk in the footsteps of one famous surgeon and founder of AMWA. It's a detour well worth taking, and one that just might change your life.

AMWA Breast Cancer Task Force

AMWA was one of the stakeholders invited by Virginia Moyer, MD, MPH, Chair of the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force, to participate in the USPSTF BRCA Risk Assessment & Counseling/ Testing Webinar regarding the draft evidence report and draft recommendation statement on BRCA mutation screening. The webinar was attended by the newly formed AMWA Breast Cancer Task Force on Tuesday, April 2, 2013, after which the

draft evidence report and draft recommendation statement were reviewed. The AMWA Breast Cancer Task Force has submitted feedback to the USPSTF for consideration before the final report and recommendation statement are published. We look forward to the publication of the final evidence report and recommendation statement from USPSTF.

Awards Summary

Presidential Award

Michelle Bachelet, MD was the first Under-Secretary-General and Executive Director of UN Women, which was established on July 2, 2010 by the United Nations General Assembly. Under Dr. Bachelet's leadership, UN Women led, supported and coordinated work on gender equality and the empowerment of women at global, regional and country levels. Dr. Bachelet most recently served as President of Chile from 2006 to 2010. A long-time champion of women's rights, she has advocated for gender equality and women's empowerment throughout her career. One of her major successes as President of Chile was her decision to save billions of dollars in revenue to spend on issues such as pension reform, social protection programs for women and children,

and research and development, despite the financial crisis. Other initiatives included tripling the number of free early child-care centers for low-income families and the completion of some 3,500 child-care centers around the country. Dr. Bachelet also held ministerial portfolios in the Chilean Government as Minister of Defense and Minister of Health. As Defense Minister, Dr. Bachelet introduced gender policies intended to improve conditions for women in the military and police forces. As Minister of Health, she implemented health care reform, improving attention to primary care facilities with the aim of ensuring better and faster health care for families.

Elizabeth Blackwell Award

Kim Templeton, MD is Professor of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Kansas Medical Center in Kansas City. She has been the orthopedic residency program director for the past several years, serves on the Graduate Medical Education executive committee, and is the incoming chair of the University of Kansas School of Medicine Promotion and Tenure Committee. She was named a "Top Doc" by Ingram's magazine and received the Marjorie J. Siddridge leadership award for women in medicine from the University of Kansas in 2012. Dr. Templeton is currently the president of the U.S. Bone and Joint Initiative, a non-profit organization consisting of over 100 organizations engaged in the care of people with musculoskeletal conditions. Dr. Templeton serves on the executive committee of the Sex and Gender Women's Health

Collaborative (a collaborative effort of the ACWHP, AMWA, and SWHR). Dr. Templeton is an invited founding board member of the Academy of Women's Health. Dr. Templeton was the first McCann Professor of Women in Medicine and Science. She organized and currently chairs the Women Physicians' Caucus of the Kansas Medical Society. Dr. Templeton previously served on the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons' Council for Research, Quality Assessment and Technology. She is currently president of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. She is past-president of the Kansas Orthopedic Society, the Mid-Central States Orthopedic Society, the Ruth Jackson Orthopedic Society and the Medical Society of Johnson and Wyandotte Counties.

Bertha Van Hoosen Award

Diana J. Galindo MD, FACS, AGSF served as president of the American Medical Women's Association in 2007. She is a practicing internist geriatrician and educator at the Cleveland Clinic in Florida. She is currently a Fellow of both the American College of Physicians and the American Geriatrics Society. She was also an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Miami's School of Medicine. Dr. Galindo earned her medical degree at the University of the Philippines College of Medicine and received her postgraduate training in internal medicine at St. Mary's Hospital (a major affiliate of Yale University). She earned her geriatrics fellowship at the University of Miami where she held a faculty appointment as Associate Professor of Medicine. The Consumers Research Council of America and The Best Doctors in America have recognized her as one of the top doctors in geriatrics. Cleveland Clinic Florida recognized her as Educator of the Year in 2011. She was also recognized as one of the Top 100 Most Influential Filipino Women in the

US in 2008 (Innovators and Thought Leaders category) by the Filipina Women's Network. Her female peers at the Cleveland Clinic have recognized her for her work at the local and national levels with the "Physician of Achievement Award." Dr. Galindo has been consistently chosen as one of the Top Doctors of South Florida in geriatrics by the Gold Coast Magazine of South Florida. Her passion has always been affordable and good health care for all and empowering all women, especially women in medicine. As president of AMWA in 2007, she set Universal Access to Care and Caring for Older Women as her agenda. AMWA organized a national "Conversation about Health Care" with the leading presidential candidates at that time to determine their views on health care. Dr. Galindo and her partner, Emilio Labrador, live in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. She enjoys reading (she is a member of her community's book club), traveling, gardening and has a brown belt in karate.

Anne C. Carter Leadership Award

Neha A. Deshpande is enrolled in the MD program at Harvard Medical School and has been active in promoting women in medicine and women's health issues since her undergraduate years. As an undergraduate student at Johns Hopkins University, Deshpande founded the Women's Pre-Health Leadership Society to promote the next generation of women in medicine. During her first year of medical school, she served as one of the Co-Presidents of the Harvard AMWA student branch and then as the AMWA National Student Treasurer. Deshpande was also the 2012 recipient of the AMWA Young Woman in Science Award and received first prize for her first-author research on pregnancy outcomes in kidney and liver transplant recipients. Outside of AMWA, Deshpande is active in promoting women's health through both research and volunteerism. She is the Director of Health Education of

Pasand, a young non-profit organization that brings sanitary pads for the cost of a penny and reproductive health education to school-aged girls in Southeast Asia. Deshpande has a strong passion for clinical research and has written extensively about various women's health issues including domestic violence prevention, global sex trafficking, surgical obstetrics, obstetric anesthesia, post-transplantation pregnancy management, medical ethics in obstetrics and humanism in medicine. At Harvard, Deshpande is President of the Ob/Gyn Interest Group and former director of PHACE, a volunteer program that brings sexual health education to high-risk teens in the Boston Title 1 Public Schools. She is also a Harry S. Truman Scholar, USA TODAY College Academic First-Team winner, Intel Science Talent Search Finalist, and a former intern and science writer for the U.S. Surgeon General.

In 2013, AMWA is extending its partnership with HealthyWomen, the nation's leading, nonprofit women's health resource. HealthyWomen will have an increased presence on the AMWA website to share timely consumer health-related content, and AMWA will

provide HealthyWomen with medical experts who can review newly created health and wellness content that will be available at **HealthyWomen.org**.

AMWA and HealthyWomen will continue to work together to annually survey AMWA members to determine what type of educational materials are working for providers and how well they are working, what topics need to be covered, and whether there is a need for content in additional languages. This feedback allows HealthyWomen to create materials that meet the patients' and the health providers' ongoing needs. Past surveys prompted the creation of various electronic publications and the successful *Vitamin D and Your Bone Health* tip card.

National Student President-Elect and AMWA Board of Directors Jackie Wong attended APSA's 9th annual meeting to give presentations on the role of women in medicine and research. In March, the journal *Nature* issued a special issue entirely on the status of women in medicine and research, stating that, "science remains institutionally sexist." The need for action against gender inequality was advocated for by both Dr. Aggarwal's presentation from the American Medical Association (AMA) Women Physicians Congress and Wong's presentation from the AMWA Student Division.

Wong and Dr. Aggarwal have also left this conference with a newfound purpose: they have begun a new partnership to bring the AMWA chapters of all Chicago-area medical schools together to create and sustain local promotion of women in medicine. Their collective goals are to create a (1) tight-knit community of women's advocacy and mentorship across Chicago and (2) develop city wide programs that seek to understand the similar and unique challenges young women in medicine from varied ethnic and social backgrounds often encounter, with regards to managing career, community needs and family commitments. They hope to formally begin their first collaboration in the upcoming month. 
Reflections on Their Experience
