AMWA AWARDS

Presidential Award

The AMWA Presidential Award was instituted this year to recognize James Heller for his enduring and outstanding dedication to the advancement of women in medicine. His generosity has been integral in the success and advancement of scores of AMWA medical students, as well as other AMWA programs.

James Heller is the son of the late Anne C. Carter, MD, an active AMWA member.

Elizabeth Blackwell Award

AMWA's Elizabeth Blackwell Award, initiated in 1949 by Elise S. L'Esperance, MD, is granted annually to a woman physician who has made the most outstanding contribution to the cause of women in the field of medicine. Among the criteria for AMWA's highest honor is a demonstrated commitment, originality, innovation, or creativity in her field of medicine.



Dr. Luanne Thorndyke

AMWA is pleased to name Luanne Thorndyke, MD, Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs at the University of Massachusetts Medical School (UMMS), as the 2012 recipient. Luanne Thorndyke has led programs in faculty development, mentoring, leadership and advancement of women, and faculty competencies. She has extensive experience in educational planning, program implementation, and facilitating initiatives in professional development and

mentoring, women's leadership development, equity, and diversity. She established a junior faculty development program that has become a recognized model for faculty development, mentoring, and program evaluation. In her current role, she is responsible for all matters related to faculty, including professional and leadership development, academic affairs (promotion and tenure), recruitment/retention/satisfaction, and diversity/gender and equity issues.

Woman in Science Award

The Woman in Science Award is presented to a woman physician who has made exceptional contributions to medical science, especially in women's health, through her basic and/or clinical research, publications, and leadership in her field. Among the criteria are evidence of top-quality scientific research, extensive publication record, and a high national leadership profile.



Dr. Pamela Lipsett

AMWA has named Pamela Lipsett, MD, Professor of Surgery at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, as the 2012 recipient. As a child, in spite of physical handicaps, Pamela Lipsett determined to become a surgeon. She received her medical degree

from the University of Massachusetts School of Medicine. She was only the third woman to complete the rigorous Halsted Surgery Residency at Johns Hopkins University. Under her lead-

ership in diverse roles at the medical center, more women medical students now enter surgical residency training throughout the country. She became the first female Professor of Surgery at The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, and now also holds the Warfield M. Firor Chair of Surgery, and appointments in the Departments of Anesthesiology, Critical Care Medicine and in the School of Nursing.

Lila A. Wallis Women's Health Award

The Lila Wallis Women's Health Award honors an individual whose lifetime achievements, accomplishments, motivations, mentorship, energy and enthusiasm for women's healthcare, education, and research reflect the trailblazing achievements and influence in women's health exemplified by past AMWA President Lila A. Wallis, MD, MACP.

The 2012 recipient is Nawal M. Nour, MD, MPH, Director of the Ambulatory Obstetrics Practice at the Harvard-affiliated Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston and the African Women's Health Center. Dr. Nour established the African Women's Health Center. It is devoted to the medical needs of African women who have undergone female genital cutting (FGC), also known as female circumcision. She helped develop a surgical procedure that can help alleviate some of the negative effects of FGC, such as urinary tract infections, painful menstrual periods, painful sexual intercourse, and difficulty conceiving and giving birth.

Bertha Van Hoosen Award

The annual award honors a woman physician who has been an active member of the association for at least five years and who has demonstrated exceptional leadership and service to AMWA. The award is named in honor of Bertha Van Hoosen, MD who founded AMWA in 1915.

AMWA has named Clarita Herrera, MD, the 2012 recipient of the Bertha Van Hoosen Award. Dr. Herrera was AMWA president from 1998 to 1999 and has been involved with nearly every aspect of AMWA leadership and governance. She founded AMWA's Woman in Science Award in 1993 in order to recognize the important contributions that women make to the science of medicine. She is the 2008 recipient of AMWA's President's Recognition Award, which recognizes the achievements and contributions of outstanding individuals and a 1994 and 1997 recipient of the AMWA Community Service Award. She has also served as an AMWA delegate to the American Medical Association's House of Delegates.

Anne C. Carter Student Leadership Award

Anne C. Carter Student Leadership Award was begun in 2004. AMWA honors the memory of Anne C. Carter, MD, with

The criteria includes demonstrated exceptional leadership skills through vision, inspiration, innovation, and coordination of local projects that further the mission of AMWA by improving women's health and/or supporting women in medicine. The Anne C. Carter Student Leadership Award is funded by the Anne Carter family.

Linda Wang is enrolled in the joint MD/MBA Program at Harvard University and has been active in AMWA through various leadership roles. She became involved during her first year of medical school, serving as one of the directors of the Harvard AMWA student branch and then as Region 1 Student Coordinator. In addition to her position as National Student President-Elect, she also serves as the student liaison for both the National

AMWA Membership Committee and the Women's Health Working Group. Through these committees she has helped design and implement new strategies for physician member recruitment and additionally has participated in projects that continue to push the discussion for the inclusion of gender- and sex-specific medicine into the medical school curricula.

Camille Mermod Award

Initiated in 1969 by Josephine E. Renshaw, MD, the Camille Mermod Award is given to a non-physician who has rendered exceptional service to the association.

AMWA has named Ryan Smith, of Myrtle Beach, SC, as the 2012 recipient. Ms. Smith is known to many AMWA members with her work on AMWA's social media, helping to link members and friends across the U.S. and the world. Ryan Smith has served as a legislative ad-

REFLECTIONS ON AMWA, THE WOMAN, THE PHYSICIAN AND ME

During all those years of training and for many years after, sitting in the back during grand rounds, I saw row upon row of balding, erudite pates shining from the front of the auditorium, like dozens of extra-large eggs in open cartons. There they were, the chairmen, the division heads and the Grand Poobahs of medicine. They asked intelligent questions as they plucked the remaining hairs from their eminent foreheads. How could I get there, I wondered longingly? Did I really want to get there? And. Did I have to look like that to get there?



My road to the pews up front is littered with the molted skins of the many alter egos I tried and discarded. Until I found the one that fit me best. A bright shirt, if I wanted. Boots, if I felt like it. And a hug when a patient needed it. I found that my patients thrived the most when I thrived as well. And I thrived when I embraced all of me—woman and physician and someone who likes to shop as much as she likes reading scientific literature. Oh, what a feeling! The warmth of the sun on my hair more than makes up for the lack of reflection from without my learned and reflective dome. Within, of course, we are all the same and some would even dare say, better.

How did this happen? How did I achieve this level of freedom? Because of my many mentors, the women (and to be fair, men) who lit the way, real-life sages. Physicians, patients, colleagues, teachers, friends and students. My daughter, my sister, my mother, my grandmothers. What a privilege! How glorious, this sorority with half the world. And that is what AMWA has provided for nearly a century and what it will continue to provide, in the century to come. The raw power of support.

AMWA's mission is MORE relevant now than ever before. A woman's right to choose is, unbelievably, back on the table. How did this happen? Global warfare has left girls as young as 8 and 9 with vesico-vaginal fistulas from rape and abuse. Small children are being trafficked as sexual slaves. Women physicians are more likely to successfully commit suicide and less likely to earn a salary commensurate with a male physician. All this and much more point to the continuing need for a vibrant AMWA.

We have a lot of work to do. And, because we are women, we sure will do it!

Thank you all for allowing me to be a part of the excitement that is AMWA.

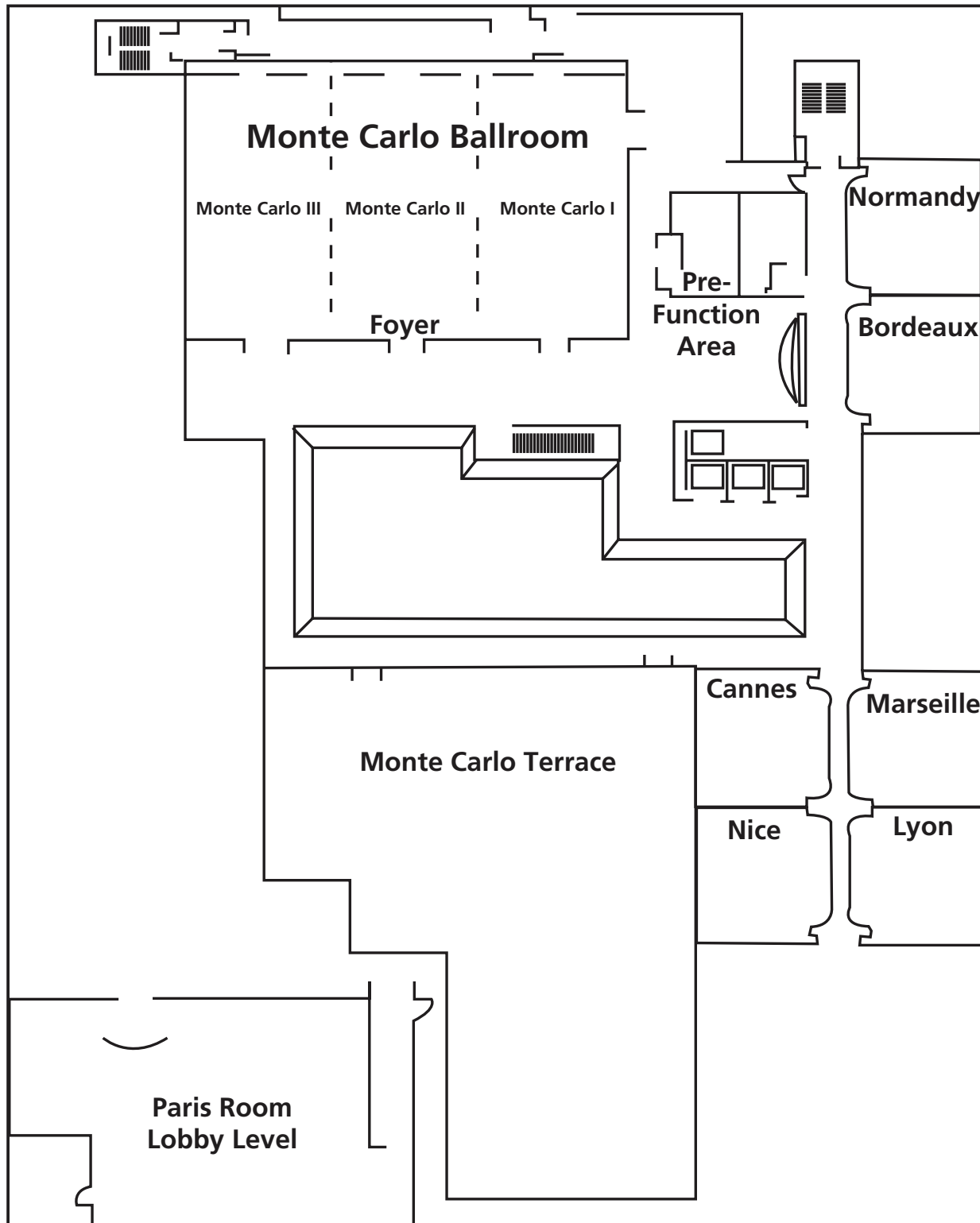
