Presidential Award – C. Noel Bairey Merz, MD, FACC, FAHA, FESC

C. Noel Bairey Merz, MD, holds the Irwin and Sheila Allen Chair in Women's Heart Research and is Director of the Barbra Streisand Women's Heart Center, the Linda Joy Pollin Women's Heart Health Program, the Erika J Glazer Women's Heart Research Initiative, and the Preventive Cardiac Center at the Cedars-Sinai Heart Institute. She is also Professor of Medicine at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Dr. Bairey Merz's research interests include women and cardiovascular disease, mental stress and heart disease, and the role of exercise and stress management in reversing disease. A prolific lecturer and member of many professional organizations, Dr. Bairey Merz, has received numerous investigational grants and chairs the National Institutes of Health (NIH)-sponsored WISE (Women's Ischemic Syndrome Evaluation) initiative. Dr. Bairey Merz has received numerous awards and honors, and her extensive scientific publication record spans 425+ scientific papers, 315+ abstracts, myriad book chapters, and countless peer-reviewed journals.



Presidential Award – Khawaja Shams

A leader in the high-tech industry for the last 25 years, Khawaja has moved industries forward by creating innovative products with his distinct management and leadership style. He holds multiple patents in mobile wireless technologies at Apple, where he founded the Applied Machine Learning team. Khawaja has created multiple organizations from scratch focused on applying Machine Learning and behavioral analytics in fraud detection, Apple hardware diagnostics, risk management, mobile payments, cyber security & threat intelligence, healthcare, digital health, privacy, search, and recommendations. He has developed teams of hundreds of people, serving billions of users and creating multi-billion dollars per year in value. He has broad industry experience ranging from Manufacturing, Media, Retail, Banking, HealthCare, and Technology. He is currently a Senior Director of Engineering at Google where he leads multiple teams applying ML to benefit billions of users. Khawaja has brought his ML and engineering expertise and vision to be a key driver for the advancement of consumer health ML, security, and privacy. He is married with two children whom he encourages to pursue their own creative ventures, in addition to a network of mentees and partners he sponsors to fulfill their own potential.



Elizabeth Blackwell Award – Julie K. Silver, MD

Dr. Silver is an Associate Professor and Associate Chair in the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Harvard Medical School and is on the staff of Massachusetts General, Brigham and Women's, and Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospitals. She is an expert on diversity, equity, and inclusion and has published many reports specifically focused on gender equity. She also conducts research on workforce and patient care disparities focused on race/ethnicity and has published in high-impact journals and across numerous specialties. Dr. Silver also developed national strategic initiatives such as the Her Time Is Now Campaign, Be Ethical Campaign, Need Her Science Campaign, and the Walls Do Talk Challenge. She directs the successful Harvard Medical School women's leadership CME course "Career Advancement for Women in Health Care" which has trained thousands of women in medicine. Her work has been featured in many media outlets.



Bertha Van Hoosen Award – Laurel Waters, MD, FCAP, FASCP, FAMWA

Dr. Laurel Waters has been involved in AMWA since 1987 in the local SF Bay Area Branch 30. She became the President of the Branch and co-chaired a Regional AMWA meeting which featured a satellite download of Madeline Albright and Hillary Clinton speaking about the Beijing conference on the status of women. 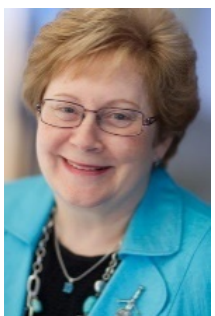
Lila Wallis Women's Health Award – Donnica Moore, MD

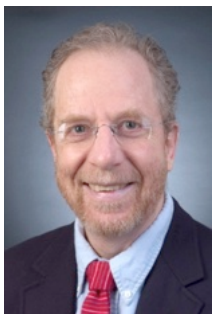
Woman in Science Award – Elizabeth Garner, MD, MPH

Her non-profit board roles include the American Medical Women's Association, the Drug Information Association, and CorStone. Dr. Garner received MD and MPH degrees from Harvard Medical School and Harvard School of Public Health and trained in Ob/Gyn and gynecologic oncology at Brigham and Women's Hospital. She was a 2019 awardee of PharmaVoice's 100 most inspiring individuals in the life-sciences and is a frequent speaker on women's health, leadership, and diversity.



Ester Pohl Lovejoy Award – Shelley Ross, MD, CCFP, FCFP, ICD.D

Dr. Shelley Ross has spent her career as a full-service family physician in Vancouver, Canada, with a special interest in family practice obstetrics. She is no stranger to leadership roles, having been President of the Federation of Medical Women of Canada (FMWC), the President and later Secretary General of the Medical Women's International Association (MWIA), and President of her provincial medical association, the Doctors of BC. It is through her work with MWIA that she has promoted women's health internationally. She has been a strong supporter of AMWA since 1984, when she was President of the FMWC. She was intimately involved in the development of the 2019 MWIA International Congress, hosted by AMWA. She often states that you cannot put a value on the connections and friendships made through AMWA and MWIA that last a lifetime.



Larry Zaroff Man of Good Conscience Award – Douglas DeLong, MD, MACP, FRCP

Dr. DeLong recently retired as Chief of the Division of General Internal Medicine at Bassett Hospital in Cooperstown, New York. 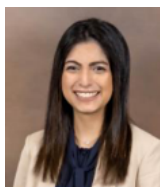
**Elinor T. Christiansen, MD Altruism Award – Zainab Mabizari, MD**

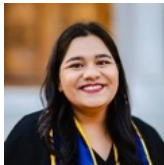
Student of the Year Award – Sarah Barhouma

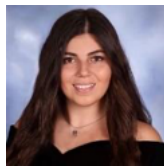
Premedical Branch Member of the Year Award – Krupa Patel





MOCKTAIL/COCKTAIL RECIPE

SIU Culinary Medicine Raspberry-Jalapeño Fizz

This mocktail from John deBary, a mixologist in New York City and the author of [“Drink What You Want,”](#) “is all about the interplay of jalapeño, banana and raspberry, which is an unexpected but excellent combination,” Mr. deBary said.¹

If you would like to move this delight from mocktail to cocktail status, try sparkling wine in place of sparkling water.

INGREDIENTS

1 lime wedge
1 thin slice of jalapeno, seeded
1 slice of ripe banana, 1” thick
1 tsp kosher salt, divided
1 ½ ounces chilled verjus*
½ ounce raspberry preserves
(about 1 TBSP, more if you like sweet)
¾ ounce fresh lime juice
1 ½ ounce sparkling water or sparkling wine
Salt for glass rim

STEPS

1. Use lime wedge to moisten rim of chilled glass, dip one side of rim into salt to coat it.
2. Place glass in freezer to chill while you make your drink.
3. Combine the jalapeno and banana in a cocktail shaker and muddle together until jalapeno is crushed.
4. Add verjus, raspberry preserves and lime juice.
5. Add ice and shake for 15 seconds.
6. Strain into prepared glass and top with sparkling water or sparkling wine.
7. Enjoy!

NOTES

Verjus is the unfermented, pressed juice of unripened grapes. It is acidic but less harsh than vinegar. As a substitute, you can try chilled white grape juice or your favorite earthy white wine. If you want a dash of sour, you can add a few drops of apple cider vinegar.

IN MEMORIAM - LILA AMDURSKA WALLIS, MD, MACP AMWA PAST PRESIDENT



Dr. Lila Amdurska Wallis, known as the "godmother of women's health" for her pioneering research on and advocacy for women's health issues, passed away at age 100 on January 3, 2022.

A long-time New York City resident, Dr. Wallis served as a Clinical Professor of Medicine at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center for 55 years.

Lila was born on June 1, 1921 to Jewish parents Samuel and Barbara Amdurski in Grodno, Poland. The family later moved to Vilna, where Lila met and married Benjamin Weintraub. After the Nazis invaded Vilna, Ben and Lila's brother, Izia, were deported to the Klooga concentration camp where Izia was murdered. Ben was one of 85 survivors, and later recounted his experience to John Hersey for an article titled Prisoner 339. Lila's mother went into hiding while Lila escaped to the countryside and was sheltered by a Polish woman, Janina Mejnartowicz, who was posthumously recognized in 2021 by Yad Vashem as a Righteous Person Among the Nations.

After the war, Lila was miraculously reunited with her mother and husband. The three then emigrated to New York to join Lila's father. Lila graduated from Barnard College in 1947 and from Columbia University's medical school in 1951. She helped develop the teaching model for breast and pelvic exams that

is used in medical schools today and authored numerous articles and textbooks on women's health. She was elected a Master of the American College of Physicians and served as president of the American Medical Women's Association (AMWA), president of the Women's Medical Association of New York (WMANYC), and founder and inaugural president of the National Council on Women's Health.

Dr. Wallis is predeceased by her husband of 74 years, who passed away in 2015. She is survived by her sons, Dr. James (Kathleen) and Dr. Jeffrey (Mary Beth), as well as her grandchildren Caroline, Grace, and Jack. Dr. Lila Wallis will be remembered as a model of perseverance, a loving mother and grandmother, and a pioneer in the medical profession.

Even in her late 90's, Dr. Wallis continued to take an avid interest in AMWA, engaging in "armchair research" and sharing ideas about how the organization could grow and expand. AMWA leaders were honored to be included in her 95th birthday celebration and enjoyed many visits where she continued to mentor and offer sage advice. In her message to the AMWA community in 2019, she charged future generations to continue blazing trails, advancing women in medicine, and improving healthcare. May we all follow the path she set for us.

IN MEMORIAM - ANNE BARLOW RAMSAY, MD AMWA PAST PRESIDENT



Dr. Anne Barlow Ramsay “was born in Yorkshire, England on 28 January 1925 to Scottish parents, both doctors. Anne studied in London during WWII, where she washed a great many dishes for the British Red Cross, the YMCA and the American Red Cross. She was also an Air Raid Warden for the Paddington District.

After graduation, she went to Toronto as a Rotary Foundation Scholar. She later moved to the United States, and in 1963 joined Abbott Laboratories as a Medical Writer. Over the next years, while climbing up the corporate ladder to Vice-President of Medical Affairs for the Hospital Products Division.” (1)

Dr. Barlow was president of AMWA in 1982-1983. Following her presidency, she remained active in AMWA, serving as chair of the American Women’s Hospitals Service (AWHS), an AMWA program providing global aid and grants to help areas of need around the world. The number of women physician leaders at the helm of AWHS have been few and far between—less than a dozen over the past 105 years. The dedication of these leaders is a testament to just how special this program is (see Certain Samaritans). Dr.

Barlow was no exception. Were it not for her steadfast leadership during the late 20th to early 21st Century, AWHS would surely have fallen by the wayside. Because of her efforts – and the efforts of others, AWHS celebrated its centenary in 2017. Today, the program remains as vibrant as ever before, this past year raising \$40,000+ in response to pandemic needs, PPE shortages, and famine in areas around the world.

Dr. Barlow has been referred to as a Renaissance woman, and indeed she was. While we in AMWA knew her as a physician and former VP at Abbott, she was also a writer, public health volunteer, and accomplished equestrian with a passion for dressage and horse breeding. She is survived by her daughter, Barbara Caldwell.

IN MEMORIAM - PAUL FARMER, MD, PHD



Last year, AMWA was deeply honored to have the late Paul Farmer deliver one of our Gala keynotes. It was one year into the pandemic and eight months after the death of George Floyd – a time which he aptly characterized as one of “awakening and loss... a tectonic level of change.” He shared with us a profound message of hope and inspiration and reminded us of the importance of resisting a “guild mentality, in order to fight for what our patients deserve and what we need to serve them.”

Most importantly, he posed this question, “Where do we go as a healing profession in the midst of all this pain?”

His heartfelt answer would become a guiding light for us: “...leadership, allyship, and looking out for each other are a big part of what we most need right now. We are certainly humans before heroes, but many of those gathering virtually for the AMWA meeting are nonetheless heroes to me, working as you do to make medicine truly humane and inclusive but also clearly on the right side of history’s ledger.”

At only 62 years of age, Dr. Farmer’s work was far from over. And so, it is left to those of us who remain to follow the path that he forged, to carry on his work to fight inequality on behalf of not only our patients but those less visible in all corners of the world.
