The interim meeting is an important time to strategize for the next century of AMWA. This pivotal time in our history will have an impact on women physicians and women's health care for the next 100 years. As we meet to strategize and define our vision and mission, your input is vital. Whether you are a student or an established leader, we all share a common goal. Together, we can reinforce our foundation and develop the tools needed for success.

One of my main goals as your president this year is to decrease emotional distress among women physicians and decrease the potential for depression and suicidality. We are collaborating with the Indiana University Center for Excellence in Women's Health on this issue, and through funding from

the AMA Joan Giambolvo grant, we will look at resource utilization among women physicians and any impact that might have on future credentialing.

AMWA has also been involved in some exciting national initiatives this year. We are co-sponsoring and planning two Summits -- the Sex and Gender Medical Education Summit, to be held at the Mayo Clinic in October and Human Trafficking: A Summit to Engage Healthcare Organizations, to be held at the Department of Health and Human Services in Washington, DC next week.

By popular demand, a Task Force on Paid Maternity Leave is now underway. Only 12% of women in the U.S. have paid maternity leave, leaving us the 3rd from the bottom in developed countries. Though we espouse motherhood as important, many view maternity leave as a drain on their company's productivity and few organizations provide paid time off, leaving hourly employees at a significant disadvantage and women physicians feeling stuck between leaving their partners shorthanded or their new child at home. We hope to work together with other organizations to raise awareness about this important issue – and bring the discussion about paid maternity leave into the national limelight.

You are a part of this. You are AMWA.

Keynote Speakers



Chief Medical Education Officer **Maryellen E. Gusic, MD,** leads AAMC efforts to advance medical education and inspire learners to serve the public, promote health, and improve care. Dr. Gusic and her team focus on initiatives to advance competency-based medical education, inter-professional education, and programs that support learners, educators, educational leaders and administrators. Prior to joining the AAMC, Dr. Gusic was the executive associate Dean for Educational Affairs at Indiana University School of Medicine. She also served as the Dolores and John Read professor of medical education, as a professor of pediatrics and has served in medical education and faculty development leadership roles at Penn State College of Medicine. On the national level, Dr. Gusic was on the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, and served on committees of the National Board of

Medical Examiners and the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. She has been active in the AAMC's medical education community, serving as chair of the AAMC Task Force on Educator Evaluation and the Research in Medical Education Program Planning Committee. A leader in her specialty, Dr. Gusic is president-elect of the Academic Pediatric Association, and has served as senior education editor for the journal *Academic Pediatrics*. A board-certified pediatrician, Dr. Gusic is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. She completed her residency training at Boston Children's Hospital.



Alice Chen, MD is a practicing internal medicine physician and the executive director of Doctors for America, a national organization mobilizing doctors and medical students in all 50 states to be leaders in putting patients over politics on the pressing issues of the day to improve the health of patients, communities, and nation. She is an Adjunct Assistant Clinical Professor at UCLA's David Geffen School of Medicine. She received her undergraduate degree from Yale University and her MD from Cornell Medical College, completing her internal medicine residency at UCLA. During medical school, she volunteered as a caseworker for the American Red Cross and assisted the director of the largest service center in Lower Manhattan for 6 months after 9/11. She was also the co-director of Big Buddies, a Cornell mentoring program based on the Big Brothers/ Big Sisters model. At UCLA, she

served as co-director of the Resident Elective in Malawi, Africa for their Department of Medicine and Program in Global Health from 2008-2010. She has been a leader in Doctors for America since its inception in 2009 and served on the board and as vice president before becoming the executive director in 2011. She has spoken about physician advocacy and health reform all over the country and in national media outlets. She is originally from the San Francisco Bay Area.
